

# Safe Reduction of Primary Cesarean Birth Data Collection Plan, July 2023

Need a summary of key changes to **AIM's Safe Reduction of Primary Cesarean Birth data collection plan**? This document is for you! **Note:** This document does not contain detailed descriptions of all changes but is intended to be a summary of most important changes and key points.

# **Key Data Collection Changes**

#### 1. Severe Maternal Morbidity (SMM) Including Blood Transfusions

In alignment with the SMM algorithm presented in the **Federally Available Data Resource Document** and ongoing data quality issues for coding transfusion of blood products, AIM **discontinued** all SMM outcome metrics that **include** blood transfusions alone.

#### 2. Cesarean Bundle Adherence Rate

AIM **revised** its process metric for reviewing indications for Nulliparous, Term, Singleton, Vertex (NTSV) Cesarean births in alignment with available standards so that the following sub measures are reported separately:

- a. Dystocia/Arrest of Labor in the Active Phase
- b. Arrest of Labor in the Latent Phase
- c. Abnormal or Indeterminate Fetal Heart Rate Pattern

Numerators and denominators for these metrics can be determined via sampling, and AIM has developed sampling guidance and tools.

#### 3. Patient and Support Network Support After a Cesarean Birth

AIM **revised** its Patient and Support Network Support After a Cesarean Birth structure measure so that it specifies different types of communication processes for patients.

### 4. Labor Management Huddles

AIM **added** a structure measure on establishing huddles that are inclusive of patients, their support networks, and the clinical team for communicating progression and support of labor.

# 5. Unit Policies and Procedures for Prioritizing Scheduled Inductions of Labor

AIM **added** a structure measure to assess if teams have a prioritization policy, rubric and/or procedure for determining priority of scheduled inductions of labor and Cesarean births.
